

PRODUCT RECALL LIST (2007-2010)

This is **not** an exhaustive list. It was started by IBFAN-ICDC in 2005 when the *Enterobacter s.* contamination became known.

86	22-Sep-10	USA (see report for affected countries)	Abbott	Similac	The affected products may contain a small beetle or larvae that could cause stomachache and digestion problems. The voluntary recall affected Similac-brand powder formulas in the U.S., Puerto Rico, Guam and some Caribbean countries
85	20-Sep-10	Canada	Nestlé	Good Start Iron Fortified formula	Three cans tampered and mixed with flour. One baby taken ill after consumption. No recalls reported. Only a warning sent out by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency.
84	23-Apr-10	France (see report for affected countries)	Danone	Blédina: Idées de Maman Petit Pot Blédichef	Recalled three brands of baby food, explaining that a supplier error caused peas destined for general consumption to be mixed with peas destined for baby food products. The affected products contained traces of a pesticide fluazifop-P (0.149 mg/kg - ppm). 10 products recalled for ages 6 months and up. The pesticide-contaminated baby food was distributed in Belgium, Portugal, Spain, France, French Guiana, French Polynesia, Guadeloupe, Martinique, Lebanon, Congo-Brazzaville, Côte d'Ivoire, Djibouti, Gabon, Liberia, Mali, Mauritius, Mayotte, New Caledonia, and Niger.
83	18-Jan-10	USA	Nurture Inc	HappyBaby	Possible contamination with bacteria which caused packs to swell and maybe even leak. Voluntary recall made for products with an expiry date between Nov 2010 and Jan 2011.
82	18-Jan-10	Dubai	Hero	Hero	A batch of 150gm Hero follow-on manufactured on 12/5/09 and expiring 11/5/2010 was found to be contaminated with <i>Enterobacter sakazakii</i> , and subsequently withdrawn from the market by the Ministry of Environment and Water.
81	16-Oct-09	Argentina	Nutricia	Neocate	A shipment of Neocate, RNPA P90357A – Lot 0680016 (exp Feb 2011), was seized on 15 Oct 09 by the Federal Police in a warehouse in Boedo, Buenos Aires after tests showed it was contaminated with bacteria, as confirmed by ANMAT (Argentine Food and Drugs Administration).
80	28-Sep-09	USA	Nutricia	Neocate	This recall involves a limited quantity of individual cans (approximately 3700) from Lot # P91877. The affected product from Lot # P91877 has a reduced protein level equivalent to 1.75g protein/100kcal - a shortfall of approximately 0.05g protein/100kcal based on the U.S. infant formula minimum requirement of 1.8g protein/100kcal.
79	02-Mar-09	Taiwan	Wei Chuan	Infant formula (brand name in Chinese)	China's General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine (AQSIQ), reported that 9.62 tonnes of bacteria-tainted milk had been recalled after it failed quality tests for containing the <i>Enterobacter sakazakii</i> . A company spokesman claimed no enterobacter sakazakii bacteria was detected during the production process, and contamination may have occurred during "transportation".
78	17-Feb-09	France	Vitagermine	Babynat Organic Infant Milk (lait en poudre pour bébé Babynat 1, 900g)	Officials of the national Veterinary Research and Quarantine Services in South Korea detected <i>Enterobacter sakazakii</i> in a 135kg shipment of Babynat 1. Previous shipment of 1,222kgs have already been distributed to the market. Following this, Vitagermine SAS (Babynat manufacturer) recalled lot number 17381 from distribution and advised the Hong Kong Centre for Food Safety of its action.
77	13-Feb-09	Singapore	Wyeth	Progress Gold, Promise and Promise Gold	Products recalled (and prevented from sale until further notice) due to presence of an unapproved ingredient, Lutein, in the milks. Recall ordered by the Singapore Agri-Food & Veterinary Authority of Singapore.

76	11-Feb-09	France	Nestlé	NatureNes Stage 2	Two varieties of NatureNes: Potato salmon (lot no.8235080E1, exp Aug 09) and rice/carrots/ham (lots 82740803E1 and 82750803E1, exp Sept and Oct 2009 respectively) recalled by manufacturer due to formation of lumps, in sizes and consistencies which are unsuitable for infants.
75	07-Jan-09	Saudi Arabia	Nestlé	Nesvita Pro Bones	i. Saudi Gazette report January 7 2009: The Ministry of Commerce and Industry immediately withdrew at least 3,550 bags of melamine-tainted Nestlé Pro Bones made by a Nestlé plant in China. ii. Saudi Newspaper December 4 2008: "Saudi Arabia has ordered the withdrawal and destruction of Chinese milk products proved to be contaminated with melamine, made at a Nestlé plant in China. Nestlé said it had organised a withdrawal of Nesvita Pro Bones low fat after a request from Saudi Arabia on October 18, 2008."
74	26-Nov-08	South Africa	Nestlé	Lactogen 1 and Nido 1+	DOH requested that Nestlé withdraw the 2 products after a worrying level of melamine was detected in products with serial code 82050179L1 (Lactogen) and 81790181SO2E1M (Nido).
73	23-Sep-08	France	Novalac	Novalac AR Digest	Novalac ordered the withdrawal of a batch of powdered baby milk sold in pharmacies after salmonella traces were found in eight babies. The batch in question consists of about 4,500 cartons filled with boxes of powdered milk, expiry date of June 18, 2011.
